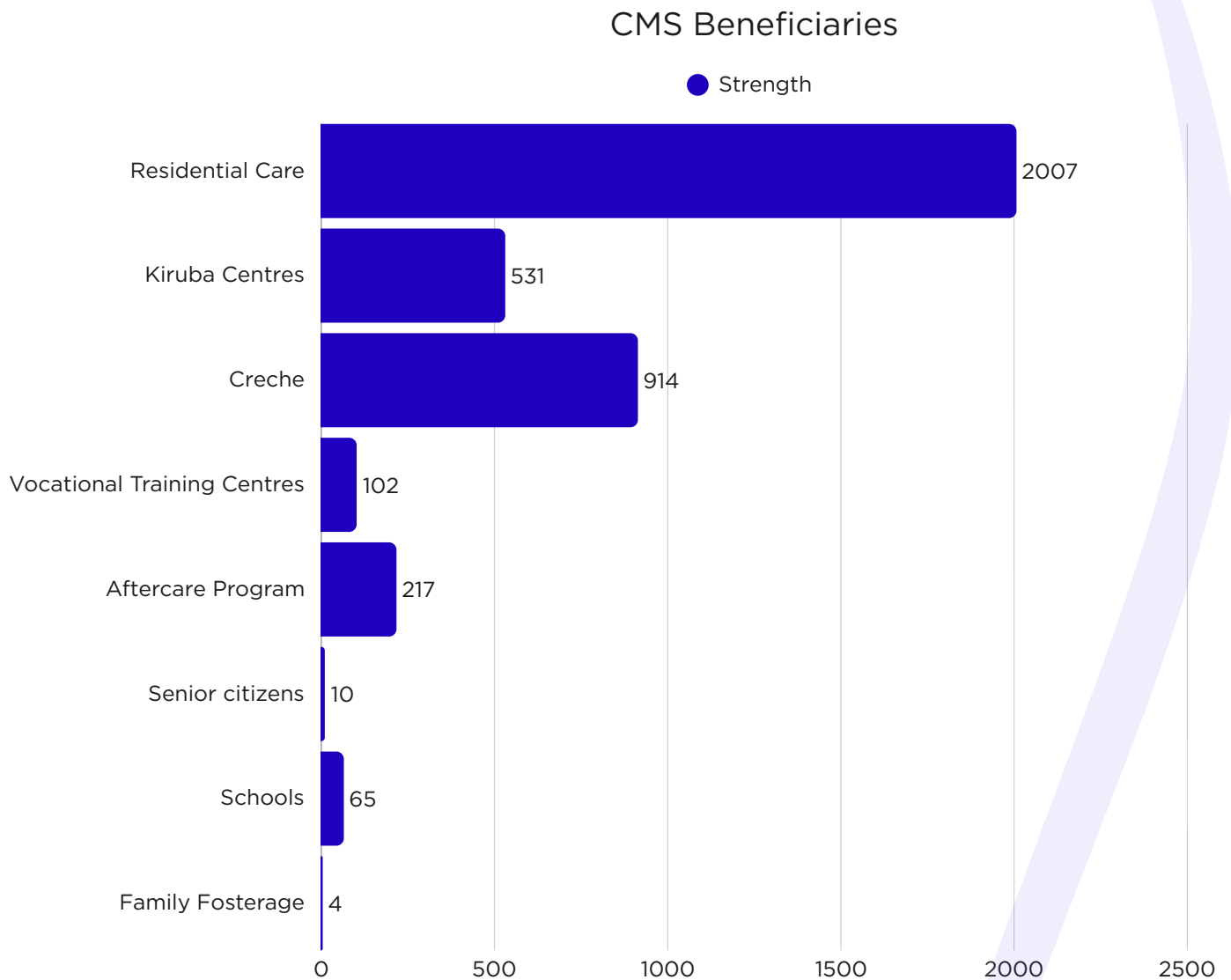
EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Reporting Period: 01 - 01 - 2026 to 31 - 03 - 2026

The reporting period from 01 January 2026 to 31 March 2026 marked a phase of sustained service delivery, focused care, and well-structured program implementation across all CMS centres. As of March 2026, CMS supported a total of 3,850 children and trainees, made possible by the committed efforts of 352 staff members serving across various programs and institutions.



PROGRAMMATIC OVERVIEW - AUG 2025



During the January–March 2026 reporting period, CMS supported a diverse group of beneficiaries across its various programs. Residential Care accounted for the largest share, serving 2,007 children, followed by Crèche services with 914 beneficiaries and Kiruba Centres supporting 531 children. Aftercare programs reached 217 individuals, while Vocational Training Centres provided skills development to 102 trainees. In addition, CMS supported 65 children through its Schools program, cared for 10 senior citizens, and assisted 4 children through Family Foster Care. Together, these figures reflect CMS’s continued commitment to holistic care, education, and long-term development across multiple stages of life.

THE GIFT OF LEARNING

S.Subramani - Class 8, Chennai Boys Home

This student was admitted to our home in the year 2024. At the time of his arrival, he came from a challenging background and had significant academic difficulties. He was unable to read and write in Tamil and struggled even with recognizing basic letters. Due to this he lacked self-confidence.

After identifying his learning gaps, individual attention was provided to him. Regular counselling was conducted to motivate and encourage him. The staff members patiently worked with him on basic literacy practice and sentence writing. Step by step he began to show improvement.

With continuous monitoring, encouragement and consistent practice he slowly developed interest in learning. Over time, he gained confidence and started participating actively in study hours. Today, he is able to read Tamil fluently, understand lessons clearly and write sentences independently without help. His academic performance has shown remarkable progress compared to the time of his admission.

In addition to his educational growth, he has also demonstrated significant improvement in his behaviour and discipline. He maintains good relationship with fellow students and respects the guidance given by caregivers and teachers.

His attitude has become more positive, responsible and hopeful about his future.

His transformation from a child who could not read and write to a confident and independent learner is truly commendable. This success story reflects his determination the dedicated efforts of the staff and the supportive environment provided by the Home. His journey stands as a testimony to the power of guidance, care and consistent encouragement.
